

The monster-wrestling spectacle known as Kaiju Big Battel descends on Warsaw, in Brooklyn (see Night Life-Clubs).

WARSAW 261 Driggs Ave., Brooklyn (718-387-5252)—June 7: Kaiju Big Battel, an oddly entertaining hybrid of professional wrestling, Japanese mooster mov-ies, and art-school high jinks, rolls into rown. The Boston-based troupe, which began some seven years ago at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, stages high-concept spectacles—the soup fights the sandwich, for example (which will reign supreme at the lunch table?)—that are rooted in low-tech productions: these local shows sport some twenty monsters and alien characters along with a giant crushable cityscape.
